To make the **plural** we usually add **-s** to the noun.

book → books

pen → pens



After nouns which end in **-y** we change the **-y** to **-i** and add **-es**.

lady → ladies



After nouns which end in **-s**, **-sh**, **-ch**, **-x** we add **-es**.

bus → buses

brush → brushes

watch → watches

box → boxes
